

How to Watch Content from Your Favorite Networks When You're Away

Whether you're traveling, at a second home, or just away for the day, you can still keep up with your favorite shows, news, and sports. The way you access each channel may look a little different than it does at home, but once you know where to go, you'll never miss your favorite shows again.

Network	How to Watch	What to Expect
NBC	- Go to wtve.net, select NBC, and sign in with Blue Stream Fiber - Or go to nbc.com - On your TV: download the NBC app and sign in with your TV provider	- Live TV works like it does at home - Full schedule and strong on-demand library available - You may need to scroll or search to find specific shows
ABC	- Go to wtve.net, select ABC, and sign in - Or visit abc.com for available shows - On your TV: use the Hulu app	- Shows are available on-demand - Live viewing typically requires Hulu + Live TV - Additional content can be found on the ABC News app
CBS	- Go to wtve.net, select CBS, and sign in - Or visit cbs.com - On your TV: download the Paramount+ app	- Local CBS channel may not be available live - Strong library of shows on-demand - You may see national news or alternate streams instead of your local station
FOX	- Go to wtve.net, select FOX, and sign in - Or visit fox.com - On your TV: download the FOX Sports app (and other FOX apps where available)	- Live TV, sports, and news are widely available - Great option for live sports and breaking news
CNN	- Go to wtve.net, select CNN, and sign in - Or visit cnn.com and sign in with your TV provider - On your TV: download the CNN app	- Live news is consistently available - Easy, straightforward experience - On demand is mostly clips and recent segments
ESPN	- Go to wtve.net, select ESPN, and sign in - Or visit espn.com and sign in - On your TV: download the ESPN app	- Live sports are widely available - Good for games on the go - Some content may require ESPN+ (included in your Blue Stream Fiber TV service after activating wTVE)

Each network works a little differently when you're away from home, so your experience may vary depending on what you're trying to watch. In some cases, local channels may not be available live, which can be different from what you're used to at home. When that happens, on-demand shows are often the most reliable way to keep up with your favorite content.

Watching TV away from home isn't always identical to your in-home experience, but you still have access to a wide range of content once you know where to look. If one option doesn't work, there's usually another path to get you there, so you can keep watching what you enjoy wherever you are.
